Congyan Cai is a Professor of International Law at Fudan University School of Law in Shanghai. Before joining Fudan Law School in 2020, he taught at Xiamen University School of Law for 15 years. Professor Cai's academic interests include International Legal Theory, Foreign Relations Law, International Investment Law, and Chinese International Legal Policies and Practice. His book *The Rise of China and International Law* was published last year. He is co-editor of *The Contribution of the UN Security Council to the Law of Peace and War* (forthcoming) and *The BRICS in the New International Legal Order on Investment: Reformers or Disruptors*, which was published in 2021. He has published many journal articles with the *American Journal of International Law*, *European Journal of International Law*, *Journal of International Economic Law*, *Chinese Journal of International Law*, *Chinese Journal of Comparative Law*, and others, as well as chapters in many English-language books. Professor Cai was a Fulbright scholar and global research fellow at the New York University School of Law (2011-2012), a visiting professor at Columbia Law School (2014), and a senior fellow with the Kolleg-Forschungsgruppe Research Group "The International Rule of Law - Rise or Decline?" based at Humboldt University School of Law (2016). He has been a visiting professor at Kobe University School of Law.

Emanuel Castellarin is a Professor of European and International Law at the University of Strasbourg. He also teaches at other universities, including the Sorbonne Law School (University Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne), University Paris 2 Panthéon-Assas, and Sciences Po Paris.

His publications include a monograph on the participation of the European Union in international economic institutions (Paris, Pedone, 2017) and several papers in International Economic Law, General International Law, and EU External Relations Law (<https://www.researchgate.net/profile/Emanuel-Castellarin/research>).

Natalia Castro Niño is a Law Professor at the Externado de Colombia University (Bogotá – Colombia) specialized in Public International Law. She is a lawyer and a civil servant at the Colombian Constitutional Court, she received her PhD in 2017 from the Sorbonne with a doctoral thesis focused on the law of international responsibility.

She teaches International Responsibility, Environmental International Law, and Human Rights Law at the Externado de Colombia University. She is the co-director of the Human Rights

master's degree of the same University. Her research interests include International Climate and Environmental Law, Rights of Nature, Human Rights, and International Responsibility.

She is a member of the Colombian Chapter of the International Public Law Society (ICON.S), the Colombian Academy of International Law (ACOLDI), and of the International Network on Climate Change, Energy and Human Rights (RICEDH).

Carlos R. S. Milani is a Professor of International Relations at the Institute for Social and Political Studies of the Rio de Janeiro State University and specializes in development cooperation and the role of Southern regional powers in international politics.

He received his PhD in 1997 from the *École des hautes études en sciences sociales*. He was a visiting researcher at Sciences Po in 2009 and 2015, and at UC Berkeley in 2017. He teaches International Development Cooperation, Comparative Foreign Policy, Human Rights International Policies, and the International Politics of Climate Change.

She has lectured at the University of Uyo in Akwa Ibom, The New School in New York City, and guest lectured at the University of Melbourne. She has taught and developed courses in International Law and Global Governance and has worked for the African Institute of International Law for its Development Program.

Edefe has been a Research Fellow at the ECOWAS Commission in Abuja, Nigeria, and she consults for NGOs, including the Open Society Foundations, and international organizations, including ECOWAS, the European Union, and the United Nations Economic Commission for Africa. As a current member of the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation's Nutrition Strategy Roundtable, she provides expert guidance on regulatory and governance aspects of nutrition interventions.

Edefe has a Bachelor's Degree from the University of Lagos (LL.B), a Barrister at Law qualification from the Nigerian Law School (First Class Honors), master's degrees from the American University in Cairo (LL.M), King's College London (M.A), and the New York University School of Law (LL.M), and a doctoral degree from the New York University School of Law (JSD). Her research focuses on the theory and practice of governance, regionalism, citizenship, migration, and development intervention in Africa. Her work has been published in several peer-reviewed journals of international repute, including the *American Journal of International Law's Unbound* series and the *African Yearbook of International Law*.

Paolo Palchetti is a Law Professor at the Sorbonne Law School (University Paris 1 Pantheon-Sorbonne) and at the University of Macerata (on leave), specialized in Public International Law. He graduated in Law at the University of Florence and received his PhD in International Law from the University of Milan.

He teaches Public International Law, International Organizations Law, and EU External Relations Law.

He is the author of a monograph on *State responsibility for acts of de facto organs* (in Italian) and has written extensively on Dispute Settlement, State Responsibility, and the Law of International Organizations. He is a member of the board of directors of the *Rivista di diritto internazionale* and the editorial board of *International Organizations Law Review*. Santiago Villalpando is currently the Legal Adviser and Director of the Office of International Standards and Legal Affairs of UNESCO. He previously was the Chief of the Treaty Section of

the United Nations Office of Legal Affairs, served as Registrar of the United Nations Dispute Tribunal, worked in the Codification Division of the United Nations Office of Legal Affairs, the International Court of Justice, and the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia. He has also participated in legal teams representing governments in international judicial proceedings and as advisor for international organizations.

Mr. Villalpando has taught in several universities in the United States, Europe, and Latin America, including the University of Geneva, Leiden University, and New York University.

He has published three books, including *L'émergence de la communauté internationale dans la responsabilité des États* which was awarded the 2004 Suzanne Bastid Prize from the French Society for International Law.
